

### 1. Deutsche Schnellschachmeisterschaft

Die **Deutschen Meisterschaften im Schnellschach** (DSEM/DFSEM) fanden am **24./25. September 2022** zusammen mit der erstmals ausgetragenen **Deutschen Schnellschach-Amateurmeisterschaft** (DSSAM) in **Göttingen** statt. Aufgrund der kurzfristigen Sperrung der als Austragungsort geplanten Sparkassen - Arena musste die Veranstaltung in die Sporthalle Geismar ausweichen. Trotz dieser Änderung war es eine gelungene Veranstaltung mit **knapp 300 Teilnehmerinnen und Teilnehmern**.

Neuer Deutscher Meister im Schnellschach ist **GM Matthias Blübaum**, der sich nach dem Titel im Blitzschach nun auch die Meisterschaft mit etwas längerer Bedenkzeit sicherte. Er konnte im direkten Duell Titelverteidiger **GM Rasmus Svane** schlagen und auf den zweiten Platz verweisen. Dritter wurde **GM Daniel Fridman**.

## 2. Änderung der Turnierordnung

Bei den Runden der 2. Schach-Bundesliga im Juni gab es bereits Probleme hinsichtlich zu hohen **Raumtemperaturen**. Im Winter drohen aufgrund der Beschränkungen beim Heizen von öffentlichen Gebäuden ähnlich Probleme beim Einhalten der unteren Temperaturgrenze. Die Bundesspielkommission hat daher einstimmig beschlossen, dem Bundeskongress in Ulm einen **Dringlichkeitsantrag** zur Änderung der Turnierordnung vorzulegen. Demnach soll die „muss-Bedingung“ hinsichtlich der Raumtemperatur etwas abgeschwächt werden. Der Antrag hängt diesem Rundschreiben an.

## 3. Sitzung der Bundesspielkommission

Nach dem außerordentlichen Bundeskongress am 15. Oktober 2022 in Ulm ist eine **Videokonferenz der Bundesspielkommission** geplant. Themen sind:

- Entscheidungen des Bundeskongresses in Bezug auf den Spielbetrieb

- Entscheidung über die Ausrichtung der Deutschen Mannschaftsmeisterschaft im Blitzschach (Bewerbungen von SV Dinslaken 1923 und SV Erkenschwick 1923 liegen vor)
- Vorbereitung Präsenzsitzung im Januar 2023

Als Termine stehen der 18., 19. und 20. Oktober zur Auswahl.

## 4. Änderung FIDE-Schachregeln

Der FIDE-Kongress 2022 hat Änderungen der FIDE-Schachregeln beschlossen. Diese sind im Anhang aufgeführt. Es gab nur wenige substantielle Änderungen:

- **5-malige Stellungswiederholung oder 75 Züge** ohne Bauernzug und Figureschlagen **beenden sofort** die Partie
- **Elektronische Notation** ist erlaubt
- Erfolgt eine Aufgabe, so ist die Partie **remis**, wenn der Gegner **kein Mattpotential** mehr hat
- **1 Minute Zeitgutschrift im Schnellschach** bei Verstößen gem. Artikeln 7 und 9 (wie bisher im Blitz)
- Explizite Erwähnung beider Geschlechter in den Regeln

## 5. Änderung FIDE-Regularien

Auch andere FIDE-Regularien wurden geändert. Wichtigste Punkte:

- Bei Turnieren mit vorab festgelegten Paarungen (z.B. Rundenturnier) kann keine **vorzeitige Spielernorm** (z.B. nach 9 von 11 Runden) erzielt werden.
- Es können mehrere FA-Schiedsrichternormen von nationalen Meisterschaften verwendet werden.
- Änderung **K-Faktor** bei Schnellschach und Blitz (bisher immer 20)
- Ist die ELO mehr als 100 Punkte höher als die Blitz-/Rapid-ELO, wird bei Blitz- und Rapid-Turnieren ELO minus 100 Punkte verwendet.
- Verpflichtender **IA-Lehrgang** ab **1. Juli 2024**

Die Regularien hängen an. Vielen Dank an **Dr. Jürgen Klüners** für die Bereitstellung.

Dringlichkeitsantrag zur Änderung der Turnierordnung

Liebe Schachfreunde,

ich bitte den außerordentlichen Bundeskongress 2022 des Deutschen Schachbundes um Zustimmung zu folgender Änderung der Turnierordnung, die Bundesspielkommission einstimmig befürwortet:

**Antrag: Anforderungen an das Spiellokal für Kämpfe der 2. Schach-Bundesliga**

H-2.14.1 Ziffer 1.3 lautet aktuell:

Die Temperatur muss zwischen 20 und 23°C liegen. Für eine ausreichende Lüftung ohne Zug ist Sorge zu tragen.

Änderung:

1.3 Die Temperatur muss zwischen 20 und 23°C liegen. Kann der Heimverein diese Grenze aufgrund einer außergewöhnlichen Situation nicht erreichen, hat er dafür Sorge zu tragen, der vorgeschriebenen Raumtemperatur möglichst nahe zu kommen.

1.3a . Für eine ausreichende Lüftung ohne Zug ist Sorge zu tragen.

Begründung:

Nachdem bereits bei den aufgrund Corona-bedingter Regelungen in den Juni/Juli 2022 verschobenen Runden der Bundesligen die Obergrenze der zwingend einzuhaltenden („muss“) Raumtemperatur in einigen Spiellokalen überschritten wurde, droht für den Winter und die daran angrenzenden Monate auf Grund gesetzlicher Vorschriften die Unterschreitung der Untergrenze, sofern – wie häufig – in öffentlichen Gebäuden gespielt wird. Es kann vermutet werden, dass auch Spielräume in anderen als öffentlichen Gebäuden nicht im erforderlichen Maß beheizt werden. Dennoch soll der Spielbetrieb stattfinden, solange sich die Temperaturen in einem noch zumutbaren Bereich befinden. Diese abschließende Entscheidung trifft die Schiedsrichterin / der Schiedsrichter vor Ort.

Zugleich beantrage ich, den Antrag als Dringlichkeitsantrag zu behandeln.

Die für öffentliche Gebäude einschlägige „Verordnung zur Sicherung der Energieversorgung über kurzfristig wirksame Maßnahmen“ ist erst am 26.08.2022 und somit nach dem Antragsschluss erlassen worden. Auch die vollständige Verweigerung weiterer Gaslieferungen aus dem Osten war vor dem Antragsschluss noch nicht bekannt.
